A LETTER FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am writing this Sunday evening, four days away from All Saints' Day, November 1st. And, I admit, I am doing so with one eye on the muted television watching the World Series.

When I went to seminary in Cambridge, Mass., across the Charles River from Fenway Park (Go Sox!), my first residence was in Lawrence Hall on the third floor and my window looked out over the "green" and upon the chapel. What I distinctly remember the evening I arrived was that while I hauled in my suitcases and the like from the car, I saw over the door of the place, carved in the granite, the date of its construction which was 1873. This was a fairly old building and my 10 by 18 foot room showed all of its age when winter would whistle through the window. What I didn't know at the time was that Lawrence Hall was named after Willian Lawrence of Massachusetts who, in the late 1800's and into the twentieth century, served for thirty years as the bishop of the diocese and, additionally, was the founder of the Church Pension Fund.


In short, I not only had a place to sleep due undoubtedly to his generosity, but when the time comes, I can relax because, thanks to him, as the one who started the Church Pension Fund, as well as to all of those whose pledges have contributed to the parish's contribution to my account, I will some day be able to retire and have a steady source of income.

The reason I raise all of this is that I've become more and more aware of how much those who have come before me have contributed to my life in the most amazing ways. Someone not only paid for and built that dorm in Cambridge for me, but also the seminary and, by the way, also the totality of the church. Ever since my baptism I've always arrived at a place that has existed before I got there. Someone has paved the way. And when I am tempted to think that maybe it really is all about me, I notice that I, like you, have a navel (that rather inelegant part of the body) that says "Oh, by the way, you did not get here by yourself."

It is the saints, all of them, the known and unknown, who have made possible who we are and how we live. Whether it is St. Mary, St. Paul, St. Francis, or Bishop Lawrence, you and I can look back and be not only thankful but fairly blown away by the foundation of people which support our lives. And that is what I'm going to remember on All Saints' Day this coming Thursday and All Saints' Sunday, November 4th.

It is also the reason Jeannine and I will be bringing to Ingathering Sunday, November 11th, our pledge for the support of the on-going ministry of the

ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY



EARLY ELECTION RESULTS (no, not that election...)

On Friday, October 26th, Bradley was elected by its members to the Standing Committee of the Diocese of Montana to fill an unexpired term that was the result of a resignation. Earlier in October, Cynthia Benkelman was elected to a three-year term at the Diocese Convention. On All Saints' Day, due to the retirement of Bishop Brookhart, the Standing Committee becomes the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese. Since 1789, the Episcopal Church has recognized that this authority, reserved for the Diocesan Bishop, shall rest in the Standing Committee when the diocese's office of Bishop is vacant.
