
## **CRECHE OFFERINGS**

#### First Sunday of Advent, November 29 - Teddy Bears



You are invited to bring teddy bears and other NEW stuffed animals, less than 12" tall, which will then be given to North Valley Hospital. Last year North Valley Hospital gave away thousands of stuffed animals to their young pediatric patients who came to the emergency room. Often that can be a frightening experience and a soft stuffed toy can go a long way to provide comfort.

#### Second Sunday of Advent, December 6 - Food for Food Pantries

We collect non-perishable food for local food banks as the offering for this day. A concerted effort to help well stock these vital ministries in our valley is important when the need is so great.



#### Third Sunday of Advent, December 13 - Pet Food

On this day we will collect dog and cat food in an effort to provide food for the



pets of people having difficulty making ends meet. The food you donate will be transported to the Flathead Valley Spay and Neuter Task Force for distribution to those who can use such help.

#### Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 20 - NEW Warm Clothing

For the last Sunday in Advent our focus is on warm clothing for the Warming Center, a low barrier shelter which provides a warm and safe place for unhoused individuals during the coldest months of the year. The Warming Center was located in the basement of Christ Church last year and has found a temporary home at Faith



Lutheran Church in Kalispell until their new permanent home is ready. The Warming Center is asking for warm gloves mens size L and XL, warm socks, and hand warmers. Please help warm your and their hearts by bringing this type of clothing to the créche.

The Christmas Caring Tree process is going to look a little different this year.

The tags have been delivered to Samaritan House and will be picked up on Monday, December 7th.

The tags will show what the residents are wishing for this Christmas. Fr. Charlie will devise a way for you to claim your tag.

Once you have a tag and have done your shopping, deliver them to Memorial Hall no later than **Thursday**, **December 17th**. **Please leave them un-wrapped**, **but attach the tag**. The gifts you buy will be wrapped and delivered for you!

You are not obligated to purchase all items on the tag; all we ask is that these folks have something to open on Christmas Day.

If you would like to pull a tag and send a monetary donation, we will be happy to shop for you! Just indicate in the check memo line "Caring Tree Tag"

along with the **identification on the tag** so we can connect the two. If you don't want to "pull" a tag...please feel free to send a check with the same notation on the memo line and we'll make sure your donation will help a family have a Merry Christmas.

## **ALL SAINTS' PRAYER CHAIN**

"What is a prayer chain?" you ask. A prayer chain is a group of people dedicated to intercessory prayer, that is, receiving prayer requests on behalf of others, praying immediately (or as soon as possible) for that request, and then forwarding the prayer request on to the next person in the chain. The way the prayer chain at All Saints' currently operates is when a prayer request comes in, the first person on the prayer chain receives the request and starts the "circle" spinning. Once they have completed their prayers they call the next person on the list. When the second per-



son has completed their prayers they call the next person and so on and so on. The last person in the chain calls the first person which is the signal that the prayers have made it all the way around the circle.

Are you interesting in becoming part of our prayer chain ministry? Would you like to, but are concerned that you're not home all day or worried because you can't receive personal calls at work? Are you unsure if you have what it takes to be part of the prayer chain? Consider this: Have you ever read a post from one of your Facebook friends in which they say their spouse or child or pet is sick and asks everyone for prayers? If you took a moment to pray for your friend, then you just participated in a prayer chain. So if you are interested, but are worried that you aren't always immediate available, have no fear, we are looking at creative ways to update and reorganize our prayer chain structure to allow for everyone to participate who feels called to engage in this ministry.

Do you have a prayer request for which you'd like to have the prayer chain pray? Prayer requests are kept confidential within the chain. You can provide as much or as little information as you'd like. (For example, "I'm going in for heart surgery this week" or "I am struggling with an issue and just need extra prayers".) Kay Lorenz (862-3248) is the head of the prayer chain and you can call her directly to get the prayer chain started. If you have any questions about the prayer chain or are interested in this ministry, please call Shawn at the office 862-2863 (or cell phone 291-3613).

## **CHRISTMAS SERVICES**



While a final date and time has not yet been selected, the reading will take place virtually and will be offered to the Diocese at large. For those who have not heard it, this is Bradley's original work which centers around a homeless man left with no hope and a handful of animals who are drawn together in a most unlikely way on Christmas Eve.

Over the last sixteen years the reading of this story has been a tradition at All Saints' and several other churches around the Diocese.

It has been the custom that an offering is taken at these readings to benefit various animal shelters and you are encouraged to remember some of All Saints' favorites, those being The Humane Society, Friends of the Flathead County Animal Shelter, RezQ Dogs and the Flathead Spay and Neuter Task Force.

The story has an inherent message that isolation can be shattered by our caring for one another which, during these times of COVID, is unusually welcome news.

Bradley is currently working on a sequel to "A Christmas Offertory" entitled "Mr. Maxwell's Observatory", which has a story line that lasts for less than a day and begins the 12th Day of Christmas. It is hoped it might be ready for a virtual reading around Epiphany, January 6th.

## CHANGES TO OUR SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICES

- \* ON NOVEMBER 16TH IN A PASTORAL DIRECTIVE FROM BISHOP MARTY, DUE TO THE LOGARITHMIC INCREASE OF COVID CASES IN MONTANA, ALL IN PERSON WORSHIP SERVICES IN THE DIOCESE WERE SUSPENDED AND ALL PARISHES WERE DIRECTED TO MOVE WORSHIP SERVICES TO VIRTUAL OR OUTSIDE UNTIL AT LEAST NOVEMBER 29TH. AFTER NOV. 29TH THE BISHOP WILL EVALUATE THE SITUATION ON A WEEKLY BASIS AND THEN BASED ON THE NUMBER OF CASES IN THE COUNTY IN WHICH A PARTICULAR PARISH IS LOCATED, SHE WILL MAKE A DECISION FOR EACH PARISH.
