



The Right Reverend Marty Stebbins, 10th Bishop of the Diocese of Montana, is scheduled to make her second visit to All Saints' on Sunday, October 4th. We will be offering the sacramental rite of Confirmation and receiving people into The Episcopal Church at the 11am service as well as commissioning new acolytes.

Before her call to the priesthood, Bishop Marty was an epidemiologist and professor of veterinary medicine. Our bishop loves animals! So while she is with us on the Feast of St. Francis, she'll also be blessing any animal companions (or their photos) that you'd like to bring to church for the 7:30am, 9am, and 11am services.

All animals must be on a leash, in crates or kennels, or otherwise restrained for their and other's safety. You may also bring ashes, a picture, a favorite toy, or any other remembrance of animals who have passed away to remember them as well.

DIOCESAN CONVENTION


The 117th Convention of the Diocese of Montana will be held virtually this year from October 9th - 11th via Zoom. In preparation for convention, since they will not be meeting in person, the delegates had many opportunities in September to join various zoom sessions. Topics for these sessions included deacons, disaster preparedness, online worship, ecumenical work in the Diocese, and ERD's 1000 days of love campaign. Annual business at convention includes diocesan reports, budget presentation, elections, and voting on legislation and resolutions. This year there are two pieces of legislation the delegates will be discussing and voting on. One is an amendment to a canon which deals with health insurance for clergy and another is an amendment to a canon that deals with how delegates to convention are allocated. There is one resolution to adopt a covenant to root out racism. As well, there will be elections for diocesan secretary and treasurer, diocesan council, standing committee, and foundation



board. Our very own Rector is a nominee for the Foundation Board. We are extremely grateful to the 2020 All Saints' lay delegates: Cynthia, Barry, Michael, and Beth. Please hold them and Charlie, as well as Bishop Marty, in prayer as they go about the "business of the church".
