
ALL SAINTS' E-LETTER

BUILDING DEDICATION

Bishop Marty joined about 45 parishioners on June 11th in celebrating the completion of All Saints' new construction. Part of the service included blessing or dedicating the church's liturgical furniture as well as the setting apart and sanctification of the new altar. All Saints' vision "that they all may be one" has been a long standing goal from many years ago when Steve Wendfeldt lead a ministry review and we first started talking about moving to one "principal service" in order to be a more welcoming church (but always allowing for the possibility of adding addi-



tional services like an early morning Rite I or evening Taize, or services such as what we currently have, an early "said" service and an evening contemplative service). Covid restrictions still require some separation and precautions, but the goal is finally within our sight. Thank you to our original Building Discernment Committee members who seriously started the process of discernment back in 2016: Barbara Grove, Bob Rayford, Heidi Sobczak, Shawn Sloan, Carl Thomas, Jerry Williams, and Bradley Wirth; thanks to the Building Committee members who took the recommendation of the Discernment Committee and the vital input of the parishioners and began to formulate a vision: Michael Moffitt, Sherry Spencer, Shawn Sloan, Carl Thomas, and Bradley Wirth; a huge thank you to our architect Shane Jacobs who took all the ideas and put them together with a multitude of variations and as well as creative problem solving along the way; and thanks to Charlie Knuth and all the Vestry members for overseeing the actual construction every step of the way and getting the project "across the finish line." This project has been in the works for many years and the biggest thank you of all goes to you, the parishioners of All Saints', who came up with this vision and supported it every step of the way. This project would not have happened without YOU!


Summer Day Camps

GARDENING MINISTRY




