FIRST AID /CPR CLASS

On Saturday, May 21 at 10 am, the church will be providing a free CPR (infant, child, adult) and basic first aid class with Anytime/Anywhere CPR.

First aid topics will include emergency response,

external and internal bleeding, choking, stroke, heart attack symptoms, penetrating wounds, head injuries, seizures, allergic reactions and use of an EpiPen, spinal cord injuries, muscle, bone, tendon and ligament injuries, burns, heat and cold emergencies. We'll also learn how to use the defibrillators that we have on campus.

The class will be about 4 hours, but you are welcome to leave at any time.

If you are interested in participating, please let Fr. Charlie know in the next few weeks so that the church can finalize things with the trainer.

It's time for some spring cleaning in our church home and here's your chance to help!

LIVESTREAMING

You hopefully noticed recently that the cameras that used to be on a stand in the middle of the aisle have been moved. I have been playing with some different locations for the cameras to try and make them less obtrusive. I have been using one Mevo camera dedicated to the Facebook livestream and another to the YouTube livestream. However, I have recently started using 3 Mevo cameras for a single livestream of our Sunday service. This allows for some variety in the angles and close-ups during the service, as well as the opportunity to watch the procession start and to see Jenanne tickling the ivories. Unfortunately the software I use for this multi-camera set up does not accommodate streaming to both Facebook and YouTube simultaneously. Streaming directly to YouTube is the more flexible option for me to use at this time, since it allows me to upload the service later to our website. It is also less confusing for people who do not have a Facebook account and think they have to create a Facebook account to watch our videos on Facebook (which they do not). I will post a link to the YouTube livestream on the All Saints' Facebook page each week along with a link for the bulletin so those of you who access our livestream via Facebook can continue to do so. If you receive the weekly announcements email, that also has a link to the bulletin, our FB page, and a direct link to that week's livestream on YouTube. All those links are also updated weekly on our website. If you subscribe to our YouTube channel you will receive an email with the link whenever we go live. At times when I am not at church for the Sunday service, Charlie usually takes care of the livestream. Because of the need for a laptop when streaming to YouTube and the impracticability of him trying to run 3 cameras when he's busy leading worship, he streams to Facebook, records the service on an SD card, and then I post the video later to YouTube and our website. If you are interested in being a back up person for our livestreams, please let me know. And if you have any questions about how to access our livestreams, our YouTube channel, the bulletins, our website, our Facebook page, or anything else, don't hesitate to ask me. Thanks!

NURSES NEEDED

Camp Marshall, our diocesan camp on the shores of Flathead Lake, is in desperate need of nurses for all (or part) of the June 26-July 1 and July 10-15 sessions.
