On March 27th the foremost goal of the All Saints' capital campaign "that they all may be one" will finally be realized with the combining of the 9 and 11 am Sunday services into ONE principal Sunday service at 10 am. New chairs for additional seating are currently being constructed and will be arriving this spring.

The combination of the two main services into one principal service will afford more folks the opportunity to participate in educational offerings and fellowship; will bring about the critical mass necessary for a more vibrant youth program, and secure our identity as All Saints'.

Beginning on Sunday, March 27th, the new schedule will be:

- 8 am-Rite II "said" service-no music
- 9 am-Sunday School for adults in the church
- 9 am-Godly Play for youth in the Christian Ed room
- 10 am-Rite II service (with music and hymns)
- ◆ Coffee hour in Memorial Hall following service
- 7 pm-Contemplative service

We will be serving breakfast at 9 and 11 am for anyone who shows up for the "old" worship times.

ANNUAL MEETING RECAP

The All Saints' Annual Meeting took place on January 23, 2022 at 12:30 pm. 32 members were in attendance either in person, in the church, or via Zoom. Charlie started out with the necrology of Kay Lorenz; gave a brief summary of the previous year (referring people to the annual reports for a more detailed recap of the year); gave his rector's report; and appointed Suzanne DeVore as his Sr. Warden for another year.

Retiring Vestry members Cynthia Benkelman, Kathy Thomas, and Betsy Paugh were recognized for their service on the Vestry. Election of new vestry members was held and Betsy Paugh, Dan Prickett, and Howard Wright were all elected for 3-year terms. Cynthia Benkelman remained on the Vestry as the Treasurer and Kathy Thomas as the Clerk. Carl Thomas also retained his position as Jr. Warden for another year.

Delegates elected to Diocesan Convention (which will be held in Missoula from September 30 - October 2) were: Cynthia Benkelman, Kathleen Martin, Jan Rayford, Jenanne Solberg, and Heidi Sobczak as alternate.

Reports presented included the treasurer's report from Cynthia with the 2021 end of year summary and the 2022 budget. Charlie presented a "state of the parish" report as well as an update from the Building Committee on possible options for the office expansion.

Other new business included an amendment to the bylaws. Basically it was just a "cleaning up" and clarification of the terms of the Sr. Warden and Jr. Warden. No Sr. or Jr. Warden who has served 2 consecutive years may be re-elected until one full year has passed.

Thank you to everyone who keeps things running by serving on the All Saints' Vestry.




BOOK STUDY

LENTEN COMMUNITY OUTREACH

As is our practice during the 40 days of Lent, All Saints' will take time to concentrate on helping a population in need in our wider community. This year for our Lenten Community Offering the All Saints' Vestry has decided to support the Canyon Community Dinners. These once a month Canyon Dinners are a ministry of All Saints' that began in 2014 in partnership with the Whitefish and Columbia Falls Methodist Churches. This is a much needed outreach for residents "up the canyon" who need a helping hand making ends meet at the end of the month. Although the dinners were shut down for a little over a year during the pandemic, they have resumed, and are currently serving "to go" meals, but hope to get back in full swing serving festive meals, providing hospitality, and other services to those in need living just outside Glacier Park. It is our goal to raise



\$2,000 which will provide a monthly dinner for 9 months and serve over 650 meals. Thank you for your support to this fabulous ministry. And, as always, if you are interested in helping at these monthly dinners contact Betsy and Steve Paugh or Fr. Charlie.

MASKING POLICY UPDATE

On February 27th, All Saints' changed its masking requirements in response to Bishop Marty's new masking guidelines. Masks are no longer required on campus for those who are vaccinated, but we ask that those who are not vaccinated continue to wear masks in all indoor settings. Of course masks are always welcome for anyone who would like to wear them, and we will continue to have surgical masks on hand, with N95 masks available upon request.

Please continue to show compassion (as you have during this entire pandemic) to those who are in a different place than you in regards to mask wearing and gathering. Some people will need to keep wearing masks, some will still not feel comfortable with handshakes or hugs, many will still not feel ready to attend coffee hour or other in person functions. We all have various levels of concern and risk in terms of our health.

COMMON CUP...BUT NOT SO COMMON


On Ash Wednesday, in response to new guidelines issued by the Bishop, All Saints' returned to the common cup, abandoning the use of the tiny glass communion "cup(s) of salvation" which aided us throughout the pandemic to safely receive "the blood of Christ". For those not yet comfortable sharing the common cup, cross your arms when at the altar rail and the chalice bearer will pass you by with the wine. We ask that you do not "intinct" (dip the bread into the wine) at this time. Studies have shown that intinction is actually less sanitary than sipping from the cup. However, everyone will still be able to receive "the



blood of Christ" in the hosts. We will be "painting" the hosts with wine, allowing you to receive communion in "both kinds" even if you forgo drinking from the common cup.



For our return to the common cup, we will drink from a battlefield chalice used by Jesuit chaplains during the Civil War. While we do not know whether this cup was used by a Confederate or Union soldier, what is certain is that it contained the sacrificial blood of Christ even in the most violent of circumstances.




TITHING/PAYMENT OPTIONS USING CREDIT CARDS

For a while now people have asked for a way to use their credit card to give to All Saints'. Although All Saints' is unable to directly process credit cards, we can use a 3rd party merchant to do that. At the beginning of the pandemic when we could not meet in person and worship services had to be exclusively streamed, we opened up a PayPal account for people to be able to give "online". We now have a second means for online giving. We recently opened a Tithe.ly account. Tithe.ly is an online giving platform designed specifically for churches. You can find a link to the All Saints' Tithe.ly account (as well as PayPal) on our website.

Although there are login and sign up buttons you do NOT need to do either. There is a drop down menu to choose where you would like your donation to go: general offering, pledge, capital campaign, special offering (see memo), and rector's discretionary fund. If you choose "special offering" be sure to enter in the memo where you would like that to go ie; Lenten Community Offering or ERD for Ukraine etc. You can use a credit card or do a transfer from your bank account. There is also a box you can check if you would like to cover the processing fees, and the amount will appear right below your donation amount. For example, if you want to donate \$100 to the Lenten Community Offering there is a \$3.30 processing fee for that amount, so checking the box would cost you \$103.30 but that would send a full \$100 to All Saints' for the Lenten Offering.
