A LETTER FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.


On June 9th we celebrate a day that within the life of the church is as important as Christmas and Easter, that being Pentecost. (Pentecost comes from the Greek word *pentekost*, *which simply means "50th day"*.) The disciples of Jesus were in Jerusalem for the spring harvest festival which falls on the 50th day after the second day of Passover. And while they were all gathered there, probably expecting to have a good time, something happened that was unexpected to say the least. The Holy Spirit of God lit upon each apostle in a way, which Luke records in the Acts of the Apostles, as a "tongue of fire". As well, this Spirit which rested upon them was accompanied by a great sound of a wind. And from that moment on, nothing would ever be the same.

Some refer to this as the birth of the Church. Others see it as the Confirmation of the Church. Whatever the case, it marked a moment when the followers of Jesus undoubtedly recognized themselves as something other than just disciples. They were now the church acting as the very Body of Christ in the world at that moment. And to that end, we see ourselves as the same today.

One would think that from this day on, everything would go fairly smoothly. After all, the Holy Spirit seemed to be pretty much in charge. But that is not always the way things worked out back then. The apostles, filled with courage and different ways of looking at the world, had discussions that sometimes turned to arguments. They faced persecution. Their thoughts concerning missionary activities were not always of one accord. There were changes in local leadership. In fact, the first council of the church, the Council of Jerusalem, assembled because of an argument around the question of how one came to belong to the church. Basically they, back then, look a lot like us in the wider church today.

Because the church marches through the rough and tumble world we all reside in, there will always be a collective approach to the faith which, at the same time, is permeated with people seeing things differently, just as people spoke different languages on the Day of Pentecost. For example, we speak of there being at least six types of people in Episcopal Churches. They are Charismatics, Evangelicals, Social Activists, Traditionalists, Anglo-Catholics and Rationalists. Thank God for that because all those folks bespeak the gospel in ways that touch more than just one type of person in search for Jesus. But it also means that we have different lenses through which we look at the world and how the Church needs to address what ails the communities in which we find ourselves. We all have different gifts and so even when we are in agreement as to what should be done, we minister in very different ways. Sometimes those ways can seem odd and even, if we didn't get enough sleep the night before, irritating. But this is precisely the way those first apostles were in the early days of the church...different.

SEARCH COMMITTEE-PARISH SURVEY

SEARCH COMMITTEE REPORT

The members of the Search Committee for the new rector had their first meeting on May 4 with Rev. Chris Roberts, Cannon to the Ordinary, Diocese of Montana. He provided an overview of the clergy search process and will serve as a consultant to the Search Committee. He encouraged the committee and the Vestry to listen to the Holy Spirit, follow the Canons of the Episcopal Church, and listen to the people of our church in the process of selecting a new rector. This is a spiritual process, not a hiring process. We seek God's will for the congregation. We are not hiring an employee, but calling a priest, pastor, and spiritual leader.

Search Process

The Chair of the Search Committee is Sam Baldridge. The Search Committee developed a proposed timeline and shared it with the Vestry. The Vestry is responsible for providing for worship during the interim period. It is their plan to continue with Eucharistic worship by engaging supply priests. Volume 9 Issue 6 Page 3

Ministry Portfolio

The Ministry Portfolio provides prospective candidates with information about All Saints'. The Search Committee decided it was important to engage in a self-study to faithfully discern the present character, ministry, and future goals and visions of our congregation. Members are asked to complete a survey to help inform the search process. Results of the survey will be shared with the community and there may be follow-up discussions in the form of cottage meetings.

Advertise for Candidates

The position will be posted through the Office of Transition Ministries in the Episcopal Church's computer system to search for potential candidates. We also welcome names of candidates from our members.

Candidate Selection

The candidate selection process will consist of interviews, reference checking, background checks and visits. The Ecclesiastical Authority (Bishop of Montana, or in the absence of a bishop, the Standing Committee) is involved in this process along with the Search Committee and Vestry. During this period, all names of potential nominees are held in the highest confidence.

Call Issued by Vestry

The selected nominee is called by the Vestry to be the new rector of All Saints'.

Prayer cards are available at the church (BCP, p. 818, #13). Pray daily for discernment by the candidates and all those involved in the selection process.

Help With the Self-Study

Provide your candid input on the survey and complete it by June 17. Participate in any post-survey discussion opportunities.

Give names of potential candidates to the Search Committee.
