

# A STORY FOR THE TIMES




Hear a first-hand account of living in Ukraine before and during the Russian invasion. Mr. Zinchenko will share the story of his family's move from Ukraine to Montana.

#### FLATHEAD WARMING CENTER

The Flathead Warming Center gives homeless people a place to sleep during cold and wet weather, and they need help feeding clients on Sundays. All Saints' has expressed interest in covering just about every Sunday dinner thru April, when the center closes for the season

Below is a sign up sheet. Volunteers may sign up in groups of three.

The groups can communicate with each other regarding what one-pot recipe they would like to prepare as a team. The goal is to provide a total of 50-55 portions.

Team members buy ingredients for their batch and prepare it in a crock pot at home or between/after services in the parish kitchen. The meals will then be consolidated into 1-2 electric roaster ovens at church. Lonnie Cunningham and/or other volunteers will transport the meals to the Warming Center (889 North Meridian Rd, Kalispell)

The Pricketts and/or another volunteer will collect the roasting ovens from the Warming Center during the week and bring them back to the church kitchen for the next Sunday.

#### ANNUAL MEETING

All Saints' annual meeting was held on January 29th with members in attendance in person in the church and via Zoom. The meeting started with opening prayers and the necrology of those who passed away since the last annual meeting: Carl Sobczak, Mary Lou Hurley, Sissy Wynne, Susan Wiegratz, and Thomas Barranger III. Charlie gave a summary of accomplishments from the previous year as well as a look forward to goals for this upcoming year. All Saints' Treasurer, Cynthia Benkelman, reviewed the 2022 end of year financial report and presented the 2023 budget.

Retiring Vestry officers Carl Thomas (Jr Warden) and Kathy Thomas (Clerk) were recognized for their years of faithful service to the church. Kathy first began serving as the Clerk of the Vestry back during Frank Johnson's tenure as Rector (2001-2003). Carl began serving as Treasurer during Gordon Temple's tenure as Rector (1993-1996) and served as Treasurer up until 2021 when he became Jr. Warden. Prior to their serving as officers on the Vestry they both served as "regular" vestry members. We can not thank them enough for their decades of service to All Saints' (and St. Matthew's and Holy Nativity before we became All Saints').

Elections were held for new Vestry Members and Kathleen Martin and Amy Peterson were both elected to 3-yr terms. Judi Williams was elected to a 1-yr term (the completion of a 3-yr term which was vacated early). Charlie appointed Dan Prickett as the new Sr. Warden. The Vestry's first meeting will take place on February 13, and at that meeting they will "reorganize" the Vestry and elect a new Clerk, Treasurer, and Jr. Warden. All 3 of those positions are held for one year, however, the Clerk and Treasurer can be re-elected every single year, there is no "term-limit" for those positions, but the Jr. Warden can serve no more than 2 consecutive years, just like the Sr. Warden.

Elections were also held for delegates to Diocesan Convention which this year will be hosted by St. Andrew's in Livingston from October 6-8. Representation for each parish is determined by ASA (average Sunday attendance) and All Saints' is allowed 4 delegates. This year's delegates are Howard and Kate Wright, Hank Stamm, Jenanne Solberg, and Rachelle Williams as the alternate. Thank you to everyone who attended either in person or remotely. We look forward to a wonderful year!

### **SERVICE OPPORTUNITY**

St Michael & All Angels Episcopal Church, Eureka, runs a wood bank that provides supplemental firewood to low income families, elderly, veterans and the disabled. To date, they've provided 196 pickup loads to 83 households.

# **BOOK CLUB**


